



## Hardy Bamboo Palm

*Chamaedorea microspadix*

Height: 6 feet

Spread: 3 feet

### Description:

A compact, clump forming palm that is low maintenance; graceful fronds arch out from central stems, creating an elegant accent for bright, filtered light indoor areas; do not over-water

### Features & Attributes

Hardy Bamboo Palm features dainty clusters of white flowers along the branches from early to mid summer. Its narrow pinnately compound leaves remain green in color throughout the year.

This is an open multi-stemmed evergreen houseplant with a shapely form and gracefully arching foliage. Its relatively fine texture sets it apart from other indoor plants with less refined foliage. This plant should not require much pruning, except when necessary to keep it looking its best.

### Planting & Growing

When grown indoors, Hardy Bamboo Palm can be expected to grow to be about 6 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 3 feet. It grows at a slow rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 10 years. This houseplant performs well in both bright or indirect sunlight and strong artificial light, and can therefore be situated in almost any well-lit room or location. It is very adaptable to both dry and moist soil, but will not tolerate any standing water. The surface of the soil shouldn't be allowed to dry out completely, and so you should expect to water this plant once and possibly even twice each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It is not particular as to soil pH, but grows best in rich soil. Contact the store for specific recommendations on pre-mixed potting soil for this plant.
